


READING GRADES 3-8: GRADE LEVEL PROFICIENCY




GRADE 3 READING: CHANGE IN GLP FROM 2017-18 TO 2018-19




GRADE 8 READING: CHANGE IN GLP FROM 2017-18 TO 2018-19




MATH GRADES 3-8: GRADE LEVEL PROFICIENCY




SCIENCE GRADES 5 & 8: GRADE LEVEL PROFICIENCY




HIGH SCHOOL SUBJECTS: GRADE LEVEL PROFICIENCY




COHORT GRADUATION RATE




2018-19 High School Graduation Rate Change

System-wide Goals for 2019-2020


- All students are effectively taught and assessed aligned to the cognitive demand of the NC Standards.

- All schools have highly functioning leadership teams that proactively problem solve to ensure total school improvement.




