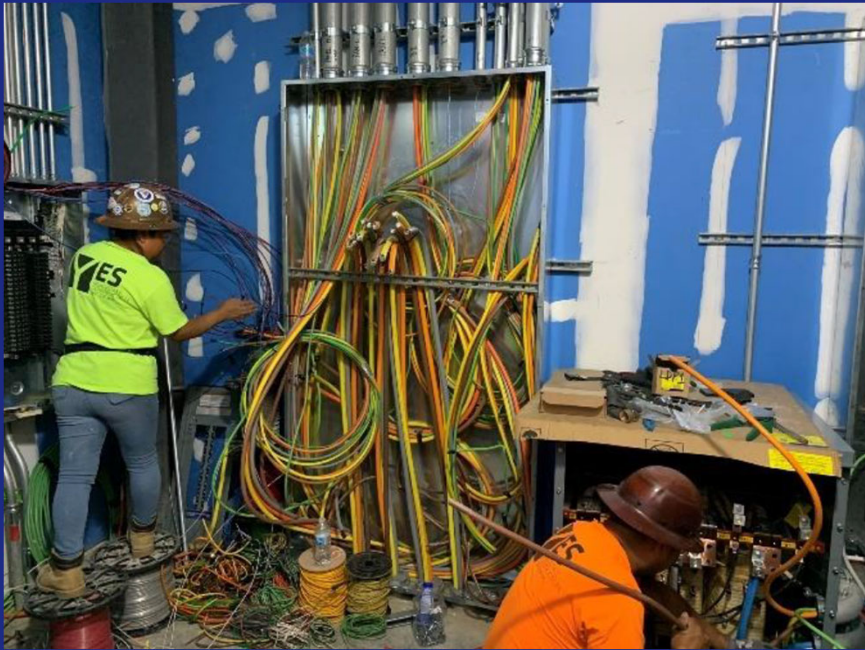

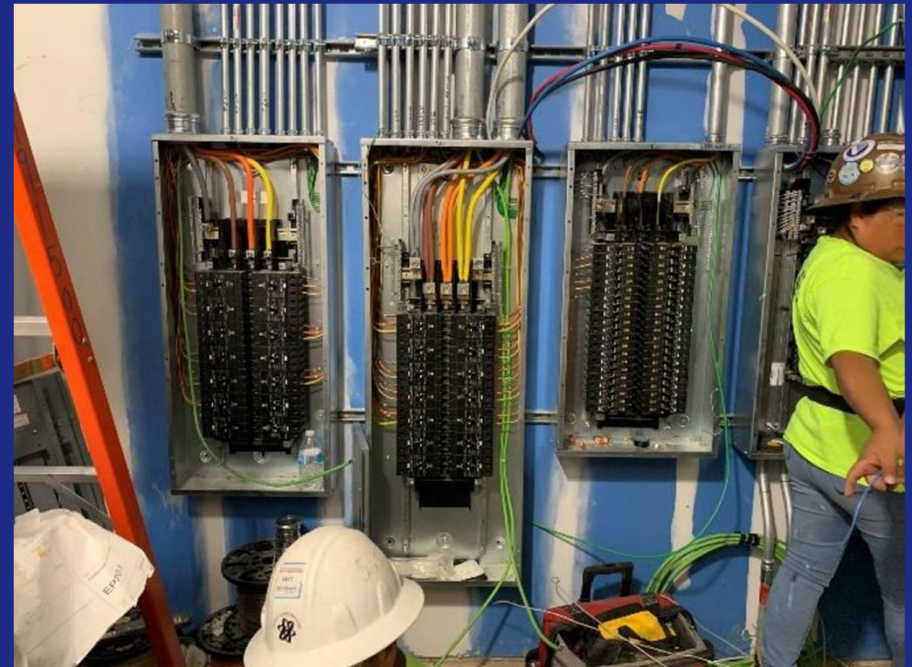

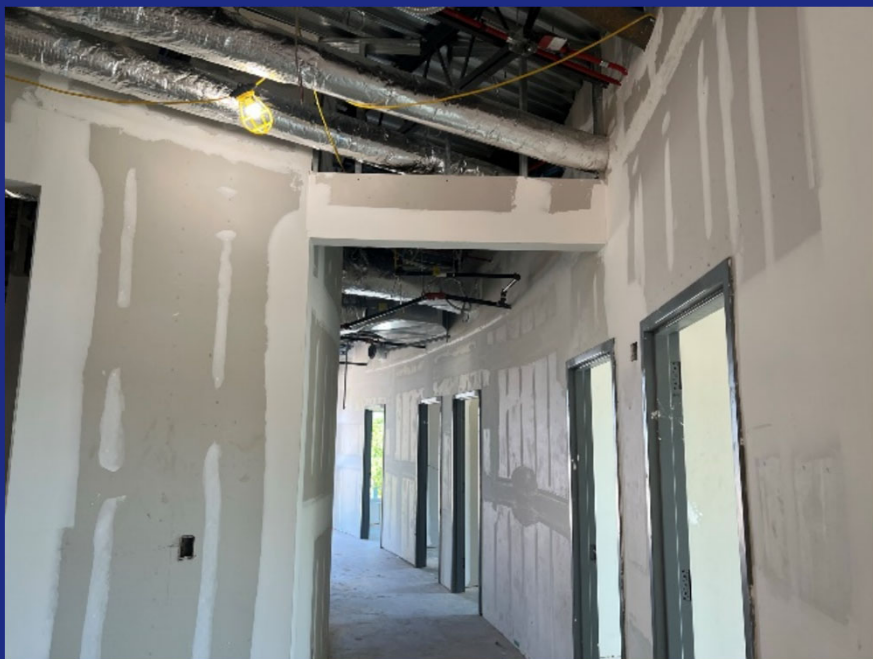

- Roofing installation ongoing
- HVAC units and ductwork installation continues
- Glass installation ongoing
- Exterior grading continues
- Ceiling grid and tile installation

Main, Powell & Gee Buildings – Classroom, Lab, Offices, Library Renovation/Nursing Expansion/Childcare Updates

- Follow-up stakeholder meetings held last week to review design recommendations for all spaces.
- Combined schematic design/design development drawings to be submitted to State Construction for review and approval end of October.
- Project estimated to be bid March 2023



PUBLIC SAFETY TRAINING CENTER



- Design work continues
- Geotech/soil borings complete – soils report to design team/engineers by late next week
- Updated construction estimates end of October/first of November
- Presentation to County Commissioners 9/19/22 discussing importance of the indoor firing range of this project
